Science week was an enormous success in Rosemont. Aside from the ongoing quizzes and activities taking place in the school throughout the week, the girls got the chance to experience a Sky Dome Planetarium.

Students interacted with the planets, stars and galaxies and experienced the wonders of the cosmos without travel. The 50-minute astronomy lesson covered the stars, constellations, the seasons, planets and more. They learned about The Orion Constellation, The Pegasus Constellation, Ursa Major and Ursa Minor. They also learned about the stars mainly the sun and how it influences day and night. The Equinox and the Summer Solstice were very interesting topics. The girls also learned how the tilt of the Earth's axis influences the seasons. The planets were amazing to discover as we saw their original sizes compared to the sun. They also learned about the sunspots which turned out to be hurricanes on the sun! The SkyDome helped students grasp abstract astronomical concepts and was most engaging, realistic and educational.




Student Council

Academic Excellence


ISTA Senior Science Quiz
