The 5km run was again a success, 44 students completed the course in under 35 minutes, a great achievement. S. Mercer




TENNIS

National Art Gallery Trip

On Tuesday 15th May, the Fifth Year Art class visited the National Art Gallery of Ireland. We received an insightful guided tour of the gallery's collection and saw many celebrated works from renowned artists such as Caravaggio and Monet. From the High Renaissance, to the era of Neoclassicism, to Modern Irish Cubism, we immersed ourselves in a diversity of sculptures and paintings whilst learning how to analyse and appreciate each individual piece. We were also fortunate enough to attend the exhibition of German Expressionist artist Emil Nolde, whose works were on loan from the Nolde Foundation Seebüll, Germany. This marks the first time in more than fifty years since Nolde has been displayed in Ireland, so having the opportunity to come face to face with his luminous colours and bold brushstrokes was undoubtedly the every minute of it and everyone left for home highlight of the trip.
