## **ROSEMONT ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP AWARD For 1<sup>st</sup> Year entry September 2020**

### **Background to the Rosemont Scholarship Award**

Rosemont School is a secondary school for girls, situated in Sandyford. Established by parents, the school works in partnership with families to teach ownership of learning and goal setting to maximise each student's potential. Rosemont, an academically challenging school, is built on a solid sense of values and a commitment to the service of others together with a deep understanding of the Catholic faith. Key to the ethos of Rosemont is to facilitate equal opportunity of access to education and social diversity. This independently funded programme established by the Trustees is aimed at high academic promise students who will benefit from the opportunities that Rosemont provides and who will contribute strongly to the life of the school.

### **Rosemont Academic Scholarship Award Procedure**

1. The scholarships will be awarded to girls entering 1<sup>st</sup> Year subject to conditions set out hereunder.
2. These are full scholarships covering tuition fees for a period up to six years provided that the Principal receives satisfactory reports of progress and conduct by the student during the period. The holders of the scholarship are expected to perform in accord with their academic ability, to uphold the Code of behaviour of the school and fully participate in the school community throughout the duration of the award.
3. A student who is awarded and who accepts a scholarship will be subject to a review of her progress and conduct at the end of each academic year.
4. Applicants must be at least 11 years of age on the 1st day of January 2020 and be in 6<sup>th</sup> class of a State Primary School (or its equivalent).
5. Students who have completed all or part of a first year Secondary Course are not eligible for the scholarship.
6. Applicants will be required to sit a Scholarship examination.

7. The subjects for the examination are English, Mathematics, Irish<sup>1</sup> and a General Knowledge paper, which includes History, Geography and Science. Questions are designed to test a candidate's competence in the content of the National School Curriculum for fifth and sixth class.
8. Each candidate must select to do the examination either through Irish or English.
9. Two academic scholarships will be given in each year;
  - One for the best overall result in the examination through English.
  - One for the best overall result in the examination through Irish.
10. The School reserves the right not to award a scholarship in either category if a sufficiently high standard has not been achieved by the candidates.
11. Candidates are assigned an examination number and their identity is known only to the Management Team. Each of the four subject is marked by subject specific teachers who only has access to the examination numbers.
12. Each candidate is informed in writing as to whether or not she has been awarded a scholarship. Scholarship applicant's results are available to the individual upon written request to the School management. Once candidate results are recorded all scripts are shredded. The final ranking order of candidates – whether successful or unsuccessful – is not published by the school. It is the school policy not to make available copies of previous examination papers.
13. In reaching their decision, the Management Team may take into account supporting documentation such as a reference from a School Principal and copies of relevant certificates of achievement.
14. An application form is attached below and should be completed and returned by **Friday 25<sup>th</sup> October 2019**. On receipt of this form, a timetable for the examination will be forwarded to the applicant. Please note that there is a fee for the examination of €40 to cover the administration expenses and this must accompany the application form.
15. The examination will take place on **Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> November 2019 10.00am – 12.30**.
