Subjects studied in TY:

Throughout TY, all academic subjects are designed and delivered to form a strong academic foundation for Leaving Certificate success. TY students continue to build knowledge through the core subjects listed below.

Sampling 5th years Subjects: To deliver the sampling of subjects, we have created four new bands: Humanities, Creative, Business and Sciences

All students will be able to study the three subjects within each band, changing Subjects every 11 weeks. Teachers select topics that give a meaningful insight into the subject at Senior cycle, including a summary of the Leaving Cert syllabus, forms of assessment etc. Students will be well informed before indicating their preferred subject choices for Leaving Certificate.

Students will sit an assessment: in October for Rotation 1, Jan/Feb for Rotation 2, and May for Rotation 3. Students in TY will only sit House Exams and Summer exams in Maths, English, Irish and MFL as core subjects.

Assessment:

In TY, Assessments can be based on written exams, research, presentations, projects, performances, etc., and may be based around individual or group work. This approach develops the girl's skill in the range of assessments used at 3rd level as well as towards the Leaving Certificate. Parents will receive a report after each set of assessments.

We encourage you to 'personalise' your TY, so jump in and start to discover new interests, skills, talents, and passions!

Careers – mock interviews; guest speakers; career research.

Our TY students are enrolled into the REACH+ programme on Careersportal.ie. The Reach+ Career and College Preparation Programme is a blended Career Guidance Programme for Senior Cycle Students from TY to 6th Year. The programme encourages independent research and can help support your daughter in making informed career decisions through understanding themselves, the world of education and the world of work. They will create a Career Portfolio which will contain all their career and course research, and this can be assessed anytime from any wi-fi enabled device. This programme is followed through a weekly Career Guidance class.

The Guidance Counsellor works closely with class groups and each girl individually to plan towards both their Leaving Certificate and their future studies toward a career. Guest speakers, frequently past students of Rosemont, are invited to share their experiences of the studies and work related to their careers. This provides an excellent opportunity for our students to ask questions and gain a deeper understanding of possible careers.
